## FAIR ENTRY ONLINE - AUGLAIZE COUNTY NOTES:

**Animal identification:** Fair Entry requires that each animal be identified by name, tattoo or tag number. For most department entries we will ask for a name. It can be the animal's name or even "pig" and "porkchop" (names must be junior fair appropriate) — the name won't matter in the entry book but you cannot move past that space without entering something!

**For market steers, lambs and goats:** you will be asked to enter a tag number. Please enter your sale tag numbers received at weigh-ins.

<u>Please note</u>: you must enter a tag number registered to the correct child. Animals are not transferable to siblings – they may only be shown in the child's name in which they are registered. Transferring to a different child is a substitution and the animal could not place. (Transfers must also be approved by Junior Fair Board).

If you weighed in extra animals, you will still need to enter a correct tag number registered to that child BUT you can bring a different animal (again it must have been registered to that child) to fair.

## Example:

Suzie registered lambs 601, 602, 603 and 604 at spring weigh-in.

Her brother Simon registered lambs 617, 618, and 619 in the spring.

When making online entries Suzie enters lambs 601 and 602 by July 1. By fair time, Suzie decides 601 and 604 are her best lambs so those are the two she brings. Lamb 601 are 604 will be accepted as legitimate entries because they are *Suzie's* lambs.

When making online entries Simon enters lambs 618 and 619 by July 1. By fair time, Simon decides 619 and 602 are the best lambs in the barn. Lamb 602 will NOT be accepted as a legitimate entry for Simon because it is registered as Suzie's lamb (it would be a substitution, no place). Simon would have to choose between lamb 617, 618 and 619 that he originally registered.

When entering tag numbers for market steers, market goats and market lambs – please use the sale tag number (the one on the weigh-in results list). Do not use scrapies tag numbers. It is *not necessary* to put the OH35 as part of the sale tag number – that is a county id that everyone has.
