JUNIOR LEADERSHIP

4-H members, who are 13 years of age by January 1 of the current year, have an excellent opportunity to gain leadership skills through the Auglaize County Junior Leadership Program. Members (13 and older) have the option to join the Junior Leadership Club and assist in the local club (option A) or work in the local club only (option B).

Members **MUST ENROLL in one of the Leadership projects.** Advisors will assign A, B or C grades or incompletes to junior leaders in their club.

Help social chairman plan and carry out recreation for the club Promote 4-H camp and help members plan for it Plan and conduct parents and family programs Help members plan and conduct at least one community service project Help members plan and conduct a club safety program Help members plan and conduct a club health program Help members plan and conduct an international program Help members understand 4-H award opportunities - what and when they are, how to apply, deadlines Plan and prepare a 4-H display for Ohio and/or National 4-H Week Help members prepare for county activities such as fair, tours, demonstrations, safety speaking

To help develop effective Junior Leadership experiences in the local club - these keys are suggested:

- 1. Advisors list jobs to be done.
- 2. Members make a list of helps wanted.
- 3. Junior Leaders make a list of jobs they would like to do.
- 4. Advisors and junior leaders agree on who will help with these jobs and when.
- 5. Advisors and junior leaders plan together before the activity.
- 6. Advisors and junior leaders have "progress meetings" throughout the year.
- 7. Evaluate performance upon completion.
- 8. Help junior leaders recognize their contribution and growth through the 4-H Junior Leader program.
