4-H members, who are 13 years of age by January 1 of the current year, have an excellent opportunity to gain leadership skills through the Auglaize County 4-H program.

Members MUST ENROLL in a leadership project. Advisors will assign A, B or C grades or incompletes to junior leaders in their club.

Here are some ideas how to give leadership to your club:

### Organization Leadership

Recruit new members
Encourage club members to re-enroll
Conduct a welcome activity for new members
Visit parents of new members to explain 4-H
Help plan club program and prepare program booklets for each
4-H family

Help new officers understand and carry out their duties Plan with officers to develop an agenda for each meeting Assist with preparation of database enrollment, fair entries Teach younger members parliamentary procedure Help plan and conduct club fund raising activities Help news reporter get club news accurately reported Plan and conduct club achievement meeting Assist with the installation of officers

### Project Leadership

Help members select appropriate projects
Help members gather project supplies
Help members select and plan demonstrations
Lead discussions related to project materials
Help members keep project records
Help members plan project exhibits
Help members prepare for judging - interview tips, project
requirements
Arrange a project related field trip
Check younger members on project progress
Plan and conduct career exploration related to projects
Organize participation in activities - style reviews, tours,
camps, speeches

## Activity Leadership

Help social chairman plan and carry out recreation for the club

Promote 4-H camp and help members plan for it

Plan and conduct parents and family programs

Help members plan and conduct at least one community service project

Help members plan and conduct a club safety program

Help members plan and conduct a club health program

Help members plan and conduct an international program

Help members understand 4-H award opportunities - what and when they are, how to apply, deadlines

Plan and prepare a 4-H display for Ohio and/or National 4-H Week

Help members prepare for county activities such as fair, tours, demonstrations, safety speaking

To help develop effective Junior Leadership experiences in the local club - these keys are suggested:

- 1. Advisors list jobs to be done.

- 5. Advisors and junior leaders plan together before the activity.
- 6. Advisors and junior leaders have "progress meetings" throughout the year.
- 7. Evaluate performance upon completion.
- 8. Help junior leaders recognize their contribution and growth through the 4-H Junior Leader program.
