Grading Policy

A reminder of our grading policy for all 4-H projects. This system pertains to all family and consumer sciences, non-livestock and livestock projects. The advisor's and judge's grades will be averaged to determine a member's overall project grade. The two grades hold equal weight and will be averaged as follows:

A + A = A Final Grade

A + B = B Final Grade

A + C = B Final Grade

B + B = B Final Grade

B + C = C Final Grade

C + C = C Final Grade

Projects that receive B's or C's will not be eligible to compete for placings or awards in graded classes. All members are still allowed to participate in non-graded events. **The only exception to this rule on awards would be if there are no A's in a particular class; then the best of class could be selected.** This rule is exclusive per project. A lower grade on one project does not eliminate a member in another category. For example, if a member received an "A" in woodworking and a "B" in cooking; she/he could compete for awards in woodworking but not cooking.

State Fair Participation

A 4-H member may participate in State Fair as many times as they qualify. If a member chooses not to go in multiple categories, alternates will be offered the opportunity. If you are contacted to go to state fair with your project, please let the office know as quickly as possible if you will go. We usually have alternates that can be offered the opportunity if we know in time to contact them. Members must go to state fair on the day that Auglaize County is scheduled to participate. **We will not request date changes for any state fair event.**

Fair Rules

Review the rules of the departments in which you exhibit as well as the general rules at the beginning of the Junior Fair section.

Grades for Members Not Exhibiting

Any 4-H member, who does not attend their scheduled project judging, will be assigned an advisor's grade only. This policy applies to judging prior to and during the fair. The advisor's grade will allow the child to have a completed project and receive credit for the 4-H year. Members not exhibiting at the fair do not receive fair passes.



Upcoming Events

Livestock Interview Judging

4-H livestock members, entering in the junior fair, are reminded that they will need to participate in interview judging on Thursday, July 19 beginning at 8:30 a.m. ending no later than 4:30 p.m. in the Exhibit Building. Members are assigned by club hours. Please plan to come during your club's scheduled time. Please see the enclosed information for more details.

Clothing Judging

Clothing projects will be judged on Thursday, July 19 beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Jr. Fair Building. The judging times are enclosed. Members should bring your pattern (or instructions), a 2"x2" sample of your fabric and a 4"x6" photo (digital or print) of your project to attach to your judging sheet.

Food and Nutrition Judging

4-H food and Nutrition projects will be judged on Tuesday, July 17 beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Jr. Fair Building. The judging times are enclosed. Remember to review the new judging requirements.

4-H Special Interest Project Judging

4-H Special Interest projects will be judged on Friday, July 20 beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Jr. Fair and Exhibit Buildings. The judging times are enclosed. Please follow this time schedule; it will make the day run much smoother. If there are any questions, contact the office

In addition to your project, members are asked to bring a 4"x6" photo (digital or print) of your project to judging. This picture will be attached to the judging sheet after judging. All project materials will be taken home after judging. This picture will be used for the judges to refer to when making placings. Writing project members should leave a list or summary of their works, but not the actual project. **NO other materials may be left for the judges to review.**

Small Animal Show

Small animals will be judged on Tuesday, July 17. See judging schedule enclosed. Remember pet rabbits and dog care are a part of this show.

Pet rabbit and dog care project members do not attend livestock interviews. They are interviewed at the Small Animal Show.



Fair Updates

Premium Payment

Premiums will be paid on Saturday, July 28 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for 4-H Special Interest projects. Premium will be paid when the project has been delivered to the Exhibit Building for display in the booth. Clothing project premiums will be paid at the style review. Nutrition project premiums will be paid at judging. Livestock premiums will be paid during the shows.

Projects must be in the booth by 2:00 p.m. Monday to receive premium. The only exception is a project that is being judged at state fair on Monday.

The deadline to claim premiums will be noon Thursday of the fair. Members not receiving their payment at the designated times above must request the premium payment by completing a form. The form is submitted to the Junior Fair office. Members will be responsible for picking this premium up later in the week. Requested premiums that are unclaimed will be put in the 4-H club packets the last day of fair. **Members not picking up premiums at the designated time or requesting them will not receive premium money for their projects.**

Early Release from Exhibit Building

Projects going to state fair must be signed out in the Jr. Fair Board Office before leaving. Projects may not be released more than 24 hours before they are judged at state. All other early release requests must be individually approved by the board.

Fair Passes

All junior fair members, ages 13 and over, **exhibiting at the fair**, will receive a fair pass. Contact your advisor if you do not receive a pass.

Showmanship sign-up

Sign up for showmanship classes will be done at the fair. Be sure to sign up when the signs are posted. Sign up sheets will be taken down at 3:00 p.m. the day prior to the department's showmanship classes. Any exhibitor requesting to sign up after 3:00 p.m. will be pay a \$25.00 late fee for entry. Late entries will be accepted until the Junior Fair Board office closes the day prior to the show. NO signup will be allowed on the day of the show in any department. Members failing to pre-register will not be eligible for showmanship classes at the current year's fair.

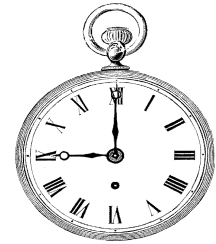

12:00 midnight - Junior Fair Projects released - unless located in a building that is locked at night. These projects should be picked up between 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Sunday.



Arrival/Dismissal Time Violations

Livestock arriving late or leaving early without prior permission will be fined \$50.00 per exhibitor, payable in cash by December 1 of the year of the rule violation. If the fine is not paid by that date, the exhibitor will be ineligible for placings the following year. Junior Fair Board reserves the right to check with the other exhibition to confirm animal's arrival or departure at their show.

****A reminder - all market livestock will be released at times arranged with the packers. Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animals until they are loaded on the trucks. Exhibitors are asked not to be in barns during load out.**

Junior Fair Release & Cleanup

4-H and FFA exhibits may be removed from the Junior Fair Exhibit and FFA Buildings from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Sunday. Rabbit and poultry exhibits will be released between 11:00 p.m. and midnight. Barns will be locked at midnight. Animals may also be picked up Sunday before 2:00 p.m.

For all departments, including livestock, please have all exhibits removed by 2:00 p.m. on Sunday so that we may clean up. Failure to clean livestock pens - exhibitors not cleaning their pens during or after the fair will be fined \$50.00, payable in cash by December 1 of the current year. If an exhibitor fails to pay their fine, they will be ineligible for placings the following year.

Junior Fair Board Elections

The elections for Jr. Fair board will be held on July 17, 19, 20, 27, 29 & July 30. Each Junior Fair member should plan to cast a ballot for your township representative. Members writing a letter of interest for appointment to the board need to submit the letter by noon, Saturday, August 4 to the Junior Fair Board Office.



Livestock Sale Participants

Market hogs, including excess hogs, will be shipped to one packer. The only exceptions will be if the buyer at the sale specifies another destination. *Excess steers and lambs will also be shipped to the packer unless you specify another harvest destination, see fair book for available destinations. Exhibitors must notify the Sale Committee by 12:00 noon on Tuesday of the fair about excess animals. DO NOT wait until sale time to try to dispose of excess animals! Remember that you are responsible for your livestock until it is loaded on the truck.*

Also, remember you must be present to sell your animal unless you have been granted prior permission by the Junior Fair Board. If you are not present and no one else has permission to sell your animal, then your animal will NOT go through the sale ring. You will simply receive the packer bid, no premium.

Drug Use Notification Forms (DUNF)

Please fill out your Drug Use Notification Forms completely. The form requires both member and parent signatures. The following animals must complete a DUNF: market steer, market hog, market lamb, market goat, market turkey, pen of broilers*, market rabbits, lactating goat and lactating dairy cow. For broilers, one form can be completed for the pen of three, **UNLESS** an individual bird has been treated, then a separate form is required for that bird. Please keep track of your DUNF when you receive them from your advisors. We have a limited supply available each year based on the number of project animals we have.

Health Papers

Please refer to the fair book for requirements. The fair books were distributed through local newspapers in May. *Dog and cat members* are reminded that their required vaccinations need to be up to date. *Goat and sheep members* are reminded to have scrapie tags and their completed forms.

Thank You Letters

Every year, many people donate their time and money to support the Junior Fair. Please send a letter of thanks to those people who donated your trophy or purchased your animal at the sale. You also want to thank the contending bidder on your livestock. Without that second bidder, there is no sale. These letters make a difference to these supporters. Do your part to help insure this kind of support in the future. **A SPECIAL NOTE TO ADVISORS AND PARENTS** - please see that your children follow through on these thank yous. With your help, we hope to increase the number of thank yous being written. We seem to get more comments year by year from buyers and donors that they never receive a thank you. **No project is complete until the thank you is written!!** The strongest three words for securing and maintaining support are Please and Thank You.

A note to sale participants—please do not approach the auctioneer's stand or the sale committee office to find out who your buyer was. Interruptions can create incorrect information on sale records. As stated above, the information will be available after the fair at the Extension Office.

Market Animals

A reminder that we have completely terminal shows and sales. What does this mean? Any animal that is shown in a market animal class will be sent to harvest at the end of the fair. No market animals may return home. All market animals will be harvested by a packer or through custom harvest for the freezer. See fair book sale rules for specific details.

Livestock Sale Buyer Pre-registration

As you invite local businesses to attend the sale and support all junior fair livestock exhibitors, please mention that they can pre-register for the sale on Thursday, August 2 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the Piehl Arena. Many buyers appreciate this opportunity so they do not have to wait in line on sale days.

Multiple Buyer Forms

The Sale Committee gives the buyers a form to use if they have multiple buyers for one animal. These forms are for buyer use only, members may not use these to recruit bids! Thank you for your cooperation.
